The Y introduces Jump Start automotive program for young people

The Y Ballarat is excited to announce that Jump Start, a new hands-on education program to support young people to gain automotive skills and experience has commenced.

Following two weeks of online sessions to prepare participants with the basics around the workshop layout, introduction to tools and occupational health and safety, the face to face program commenced on Tuesday 27th October.

Simon Thyer, Y Community Development and Ballarat Youth Crime Prevention Coordinator alongside local mechanic, Brendan Hewitt, will support young people to increase their confidence, skills, and knowledge in the automotive area. Current participants have been connected with the program through a variety of local community organisations, the Y Youth Hubs and other outreach programs.

“Jump Start gives young people in the wider Ballarat area the opportunity to use their passion in a positive way with a view towards building a career pathway. Some participants are not currently engaged in school, so Jump Start provides another educational opportunity,” explains Simon. “We’re really excited to be launching this program which is unique in Ballarat, in its structure, delivery and focus.”

The idea for Jump Start was born after consistent interest in the automotive area by a number of young people in local programs such as Ballarat Youth Crime Prevention’s MAST program. The MAST program supports young people to engage in positive social recreation activities and opportunities.

The Y’s belief ‘in the power of inspired young people’ will be in evidence during Jump Start sessions. The program has an emphasis on providing opportunities for involvement, skill development and empowerment.

The pilot program runs for 4 weeks, with 10 participants aged 14-18 years as part of the first intake. Following the pilot, work will commence to explore Jump Start continuing into the future.
